The CDC resource explains how long you can store breast milk on the counter, in the refrigerator, and in the freezer. It includes the safest way of handling, storing, and feeding expressed breast milk. They also have colorful printable handouts to give to staff and families and display in your care space.

Despite significant efforts to prevent mix-ups, occasionally, expressed breast milk from a mother is given to another mother's child in error. If a child is mistakenly fed another child's bottle of expressed breast milk this resource provides guidance on how to sensitively minimize fear among both families, and which steps should be taken to appropriately manage the situation in a timely manner.

- [Maine’s Labor Law to Support Working Mothers](#)  
This law shares what is required of employers to support employees who are breastfeeding or expressing their breast milk. It reviews specifics to offering appropriate time and space to make breastfeeding in the workplace easier.

Great resource to learn all about the practice of responsive feeding and how to understand, recognize, and respond to babies’ hunger or fullness cues. You can practice responsive feeding when breastfeeding, bottle feeding and when providing solid foods.
